

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FINDINGS, ORDER AND JOURNAL ENTRY

On October 13, 1988, notice was given to Earl C. Hahn, D.O., that the State Medical Board of Ohio intended to consider disciplinary action regarding his license to practice osteopathic medicine and surgery in Ohio, and that he was entitled to a hearing if such hearing was requested within thirty (30) days of the mailing of said notice. Dr. Hahn has not requested a hearing, and more than thirty (30) days have elapsed since the mailing of aforesaid notice.

WHEREFORE, for the reasons outlined in the October 13, 1988 letter of notice, which is attached hereto and fully incorporated herein, it is hereby ORDERED:

1. That the license of Earl C. Hahn, D.O., to practice osteopathic medicine and surgery in Ohio be suspended for an indefinite term, which shall last a minimum of thirty (30) days.
2. Further, that the State Medical Board of Ohio shall not consider reinstatement of Dr. Hahn's certificate unless and until all the following minimum requirements are met:
 - A. Dr. Hahn shall apply for reinstatement and shall submit all accompanying fees.
 - B. Dr. Hahn shall provide documentation acceptable to the Board of his satisfactory completion of 100 hours of Continuing Medical Education credits for the 1985-1986 biennium, at least forty (40) hours of which shall be in Category I. It shall be Dr. Hahn's responsibility to work with appropriate Board staff to ascertain what will be considered as satisfactory documentation and to obtain the same.

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- C. Dr. Hahn shall supply documentaton acceptable to the Board of satisfactory completion of one hundred (100) hours of approved Continuing Medical Education, at least forty (40) of which shall be in Category I, for each complete biennium, if any, during which his certificate remains suspended after the 1987-1988 biennium.
- D. In the event that Dr. Hahn has not been engaged in the active practice of medicine for a period of more than two (2) years prior to his application for reinstatement, Dr. Hahn shall take and pass the SPEX examination or any similar written examination which the Board may deem appropriate to assess his clinical competency.
3. Subsequent to reinstatement of his certificate, Dr. Hahn shall remain on probation for three (3) additional biennial registration periods and shall submit documentation acceptable to the Board of satisfactory completion of requisite hours of Continuing Medical Education for each biennium. Such documentation shall be due in the Board's offices within thirty (30) days of re-registration for each biennium.
4. Upon successful completion of probation, Dr. Hahn's certificate will be fully restored.

This Order shall become effective immediately upon mailing of notification of approval by the State Medical Board of Ohio.

This ORDER is hereby entered upon the Journal of the State Medical Board of Ohio for the 7th day of December, 1988, and the original thereof shall be kept with said Journal.

Dear Doctor Hahn:

In accordance with Chapter 119., Ohio Revised Code, you are hereby notified that the State Medical Board of Ohio intends to determine whether or not to limit, revoke, suspend, refuse to register or reinstate your certificate to practice medicine or surgery or to reprimand or place you on probation for one or more of the of the following reasons:

1. In applying for registration of your certificate to practice medicine or surgery for the current registration period, you certified that you had completed during the last registration period (January 1, 1985 through December 31, 1986) the requisite hours of Continuing Medical Education, as required by Section 4731.281, Ohio Revised Code.
2. By letter dated July 10, 1987, you were notified by the State Medical Board that you are required to complete a log listing your Continuing Medical Education, and to provide documentation that you had actually attended 40 hours of Category I credits. A second letter, dated September 18, 1987, was mailed to you to notify you of this requirement. In response to the second letter you indicated in a telephone conversation with Ms. Debra Jones of this office on September 30, 1987, that you had been ill and would send a statement to that effect. On March 7, 1988, you were again notified of the requirement to provide documentation of you C.M.E. On March 9, 1988, you again indicated in a telephone conversation with Ms. Jones that you had been ill and would send a statement to that effect. No further response was received. You have not submitted documentation of the required number of hours of C.M.E. completed during the 1985-1986 registration period.
3. Your response to the notices as detailed in the above Paragraph (2) established that you did not complete the requisite hours of Continuing Medical Education, and/or that you failed to keep detailed records of C.M.E. taken.

The acts and omissions as alleged in the above paragraphs (1), individually and/or collectively, constitute "fraud, misrepresentation, or deception in applying for or securing any license or certificate issued by the Board," as that clause is used in Section 4731.22(A), Ohio Revised Code.

Further, such acts as alleged in the above paragraphs (1), individually and/or collectively, constitute "publishing a false, fraudulent, deceptive, or misleading statement," as that clause is used in Section 4731.22(B)(5), Ohio Revised Code.

Further, such acts as alleged in the above paragraphs (1), (2), and (3), individually and/or collectively, constitute "violating or attempting to violate directly or indirectly, assisting or abetting the violation of, or conspiring to violate, any provisions of this Chapter, or any rule promulgated by the Board," as that clause is used in Section 4731.22(B)(20), Ohio Revised Code, (Section 4731.22(B)(16), Ohio Revised Code, prior to March 17, 1987) to wit: Section 4731.281, Ohio Revised Code, Rule 4731-10-03, and Rule 4731-10-08, Ohio Administrative Code.

Pursuant to Chapter 119, Ohio Revised Code, you are hereby advised that you are entitled to a hearing in this matter. If you wish to request such hearing, that request must be received in the offices of the State Medical Board within thirty (30) days of the time of mailing of this notice.

You are further advised that you are entitled to appear at such hearing in person, or by your attorney, or by such other representative as is permitted to practice before the agency, or you may present your position, arguments, or contentions in writing, and that at the hearing you may present evidence and examine witnesses appearing for or against you.

In the event that there is no request for such hearing received within thirty (30) days of the time of mailing of this notice, the State Medical Board may, in your absence and upon consideration of this matter, determine whether or not to limit, revoke, suspend, refuse to register or reinstate your certificate to practice medicine and surgery or to reprimand or place you on probation.
