

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FINDINGS, ORDER, AND JOURNAL ENTRY

This matter came on for consideration after a citation letter was issued to Andreas L. Lutz, M.D. by the State Medical Board of Ohio on June 15, 1988.

On June 15, 1988 notice was given to Dr. Lutz that the State Medical Board intended to consider disciplinary action regarding his license to practice medicine and surgery in Ohio, and that he was entitled to a hearing if such hearing was requested within thirty (30) days of the mailing of said notice. In accordance with Section 119.09, Ohio Revised Code, said notice was sent via certified mail, return receipt requested, to the last known address of record of Dr. Lutz, that being 2736 Glenwood, Highland, Indiana 46322.

Dr. Lutz responded in a letter received in the Board offices on July 13, 1988 by attempting to surrender his registration card, #21516. He did not request a hearing.

By certified letter dated September 22, 1989, over the signature of Medical Board Secretary Henry G. Cramblett, M.D., Dr. Lutz was asked to execute an enclosed Voluntary Surrender form and was further advised that, if he chose not to execute the form within two (2) weeks, formal disciplinary action would be initiated. No further response from Dr. Lutz has been forthcoming.

WHEREFORE, for the reasons outlined in the June 15, 1988 letter of notice, which is attached hereto and fully incorporated herein, it is hereby ORDERED:

1. That the license of Andreas L. Lutz, M.D., to practice medicine and surgery in Ohio be suspended for an indefinite term, which shall last a minimum of thirty (30) days.
2. Further, that the State Medical Board of Ohio shall not consider reinstatement of Dr. Lutz' certificate unless and until all the following minimum requirements are met:
  - A. Dr. Lutz shall apply for reinstatement and shall submit all accompanying fees.

- B. Dr. Lutz shall provide documentation acceptable to the Board of his satisfactory completion of 100 hours of Continuing Medical Education credits for the 1987-1988 biennium, at least forty (40) hours of which shall be in Category I. It shall be Dr. Lutz' responsibility to work with appropriate Board staff to ascertain what will be considered as satisfactory documentation and to obtain the same.
- C. Dr. Lutz shall supply documentation acceptable to the Board of satisfactory completion of one hundred (100) hours of approved Continuing Medical Education, at least forty (40) of which shall be in Category I, for each complete biennium, if any, during which his certificate remains suspended after the 1989-1990 biennium.
- D. In the event that Dr. Lutz has not been engaged in the active practice of medicine for a period of more than two (2) years prior to his application for reinstatement, Dr. Lutz shall take and pass the SPEX examination or any similar written examination which the Board may deem appropriate to assess his clinical competency.
3. Subsequent to reinstatement of his certificate, Dr. Lutz shall remain on probation for three (3) additional biennial registration periods and shall submit documentation acceptable to the Board of satisfactory completion of requisite hours of Continuing Medical Education for each biennium. Such documentation shall be due in the Board's offices within thirty (30) days of re-registration for each biennium.
4. Upon successful completion of probation, Dr. Lutz' certificate will be fully restored.

This Order shall become effective immediately upon mailing of notification of approval by the State Medical Board of Ohio.

This ORDER is hereby entered upon the Journal of the State Medical Board of Ohio for the 13th day of June, 1990, 1989, and the original thereof shall be kept with said Journal.

Dear Doctor Lutz:

In accordance with Chapter 119., Ohio Revised Code, you are hereby notified that the State Medical Board of Ohio intends to determine whether or not to limit, revoke, suspend, refuse to register or reinstate your certificate to practice medicine or surgery or to reprimand or place you on probation for one or more of the following reasons:

1. In applying for registration of your certificate to practice medicine or surgery for the current registration period, you certified that you had completed during the last registration period (January 1, 1985 through December 31, 1986) the requisite hours of Continuing Medical Education, as required by Section 4731.281, Ohio Revised Code.
2. By letter dated July 22, 1987, you were notified by the State Medical Board that you are required to complete a log listing your Continuing Medical Education, and to provide documentation that you had actually attended 40 hours of Category I credits. A second letter, dated September 21, 1987, was mailed to you in an attempt to notify you of this requirement. In response to the second letter you indicated by letter dated September 29, 1987, that you had been in Europe and, further that you had been "inactive in 1986 and 1987." You have submitted no documentation of C.M.E. completed during the 1985-1986 registration period.

3. Your response to the notices as detailed in the above Paragraph (2) established that you did not complete the requisite hours of Continuing Medical Education, and/or that you failed to keep detailed records of C.M.E. taken.

The acts and omissions as alleged in the above Paragraphs (1) and (3), individually and/or collectively, constitute "fraud, misrepresentation, or deception in applying for or securing any license or certificate issued by the Board," as that clause is used in Section 4731.22(A), Ohio Revised Code.

Further, such acts as alleged in the above paragraphs (1) and (3), individually and/or collectively, constitute "publishing a false, fraudulent, deceptive, or misleading statement," as that clause is used in Section 4731.22(B)(5), Ohio Revised Code.

Further, such acts as alleged in the above paragraphs (1) and (3), individually and/or collectively, constitute "violating or attempting to violate directly or indirectly, or assisting or abetting the violation of, or conspiring to violate, any provisions of this Chapter or any rule promulgated by the Board," as that clause is used in Section 4731.22(B)(20), Ohio Revised Code, (Section 4731.22(B)(16), Ohio Revised Code, prior to March 17, 1987) to wit: Section 4731.281, Ohio Revised Code, and Rule 4731-10-03, Ohio Administrative Code.

Further, such acts as alleged in the above Paragraph (2), individually and/or collectively, constitute "violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the violating of, or conspiring to violate any provision of this Chapter or any rule promulgated by the Board," as that clause is used in Section 4731.22(B)(20), Ohio Revised Code, (Section 4731.22(B)(16), Ohio Revised Code, prior to March 17, 1987) to wit: Section 4731.281, Ohio Revised Code, and Rule 4731-10-08, Ohio Administrative Code.

Pursuant to Chapter 119, Ohio Revised Code, you are hereby advised that you are entitled to a hearing in this matter. If you wish to request such hearing, that request must be received in the offices of the State Medical Board within thirty (30) days of the time of mailing of this notice.

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You are further advised that you are entitled to appear at such hearing in person, or by your attorney, or by such other representative as is permitted to practice before the agency, or you may present your position, arguments, or contentions in writing, and that at the hearing you may present evidence and examine witnesses appearing for or against you.

In the event that there is no request for such hearing received within thirty (30) days of the time of mailing of this notice, the State Medical Board may, in your absence and upon consideration of this matter, determine whether or not to limit, revoke, suspend, refuse to register or reinstate your certificate to practice medicine or surgery or to reprimand or place you on probation.
