ENTRY OF ORDER

This matter came on for consideration before the State Medical Board of Ohio the 14th day of May, 1987.

Upon the Report and Recommendation of Leonard L. Lovshin, M.D., Hearing Member, Medical Board, in this matter designated pursuant to R.C. 119.09, a true copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein, which Report and Recommendation was approved and confirmed by vote of the Board on the above date, the following Order is hereby entered on the Journal of the State Medical Board for the 14th day of May, 1987.

It is hereby ORDERED:

That the license of Barry Hillman, M.D., to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Ohio be REVOKED.


Such revocation is stayed subject to a probationary term of five (5) years, upon the following terms and conditions:

1. Dr. Hillman shall obey all federal, state and local laws and all rules governing the practice of medicine in Ohio.
2. Dr. Hillman shall immediately discontinue and shall hereafter refrain from prescribing any and all medication for his wife, himself, and any other family members.
3. Dr. Hillman shall continue counseling with Dr. Ivan Podobnikar or with another psychiatrist approved by the Board. Said psychiatrist shall submit reports to the Board at quarterly intervals, or as otherwise directed by the Board.

4. Dr. Hillman shall submit quarterly declarations under penalty of perjury stating whether there has been compliance with all the conditions of probation.
5. Dr. Hillman shall appear in person for interview before the Secretary of the Board or his designated representative at six (6) month intervals, or as otherwise requested by the Board.
6. In the event that Dr. Hillman should leave Ohio for three (3) continuous months, or reside or practice outside the State, Dr. Hillman must notify the State Medical Board in writing of the dates of departure and return. Periods of time spent outside of Ohio will not apply to the reduction of this probationary period.
7. If Dr. Hillman violates probation in any respect the Board, after giving Dr. Hillman notice and the opportunity to be heard, may set aside the stay order and impose the revocation of his certificate.
8. Upon successful completion of probation, Dr. Hillman's certificate will be fully restored.

This ORDER shall become effective upon mailing of notification of approval by the State Medical Board of Ohio.

REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION
IN THE MATTER OF BARRY HILLMAN, M.D.

The Matter of Barry Hillman, M.D., came on for hearing before me, Leonard L. Lovshin, M.D., Member of the State Medical Board of Ohio, on October 20, 1986.

INTRODUCTION AND SUMMARY OF EVIDENCE

I. Mode of Conduct

- A. During the course of this hearing, rules of evidence were relaxed and both the State and the Respondent were given great latitude in demonstrating the relevancy and materiality of testimony and exhibits offered, as well as in attempting to discredit testimony and evidence presented by the opposing party.

II. Basis for Hearing

- A. By letter of February 13, 1986, the State Medical Board notified Barry Hillman, M.D., that it proposed to take disciplinary action against his license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Ohio. Dr. Hillman was advised that due to his prescribing of certain drugs to one individual, as outlined in Joint Exhibits #2 and #4, he was in potential violation of the Medical Practice Act, specifically:

1. Section 4731.22(B)(2), Ohio Revised Code, "A Failure to use reasonable care discrimination in the administration of drugs, or the failure to employ acceptable scientific methods in the selection of drugs or other modalities for treatment of disease."

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2. Section 4731.22(B)(3), Ohio Revised Code, "Selling, prescribing, giving away or administering drugs for other than legal and legitimate therapeutic purposes."
3. Section 4731.22(B)(6), Ohio Revised Code, "A departure from, or the failure to conform to minimal standards of care of similar practitioners under the same or similar circumstances, whether or not actual injury to a patient is established."

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Barry Hillman, M.D, prescribed for his wife, Yvonne Hillman, the controlled substances and other drugs as listed in the "Prescription List by Patient by Number" (Joint Exhibit #2) with the exception of those prescriptions specifically listed in Joint Exhibit #3. Taking the excepted prescriptions into consideration, Dr. Hillman prescribed for Mrs. Hillman in a seven year period a total of 3,093 dosage units consisting of:

These facts are established by stipulation of the parties (Joint Exhibit #3), by this Hearing Officer's analysis of Joint Exhibit #2, and by Respondent's testimony throughout.

2. Dr. Hillman was aware when he prescribed these drugs that Mrs. Hillman had a history of drug abuse and dependency, that she had been hospitalized twice in 1974 for treatment of Demerol addiction, and that she had again been detoxified in 1977 when she entered a program at the Ohio Pain and Stress Center.

These facts are established by Respondent's Exhibits #3 and #5, by Respondent's testimony (Tr. at 13, 147), and by the testimony of Dr. Podobnikar (Tr. at 121).

3. Dr. Hillman prescribed drugs for Mrs. Hillman against the advice of Ivan Podobnikar, M.D., a psychiatrist who treated both Mrs. Hillman and Dr. Hillman over a period of approximately three years.

These facts are established by the testimony of Dr. Podobnikar (Tr. at 117, 125, 121-122).

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4. Dr. Hillman prescribed drugs for Mrs. Hillman when she was being treated by other physicians. On at least one occasion, he did so without consulting or notifying the treating physician.

These facts are established by the testimony of Dr. Hillman (Tr. at 28, 44-45, 56), Mrs. Hillman (Tr. at 82), and Robert S. Chosy, M.D. (Tr. at 98-99).

CONCLUSIONS

The record in this matter provides a classic example of the perils inherent in a physician's treating a member of his family. Dr. Hillman failed to maintain an arms-length physician-patient relationship in "treating" his wife. This failure resulted in Dr. Barry Hillman's perpetuating his wife's drug addiction.

The candid testimony of both Mrs. Hillman and Dr. Podobnikar reveals that Dr. Hillman was aware that Mrs. Hillman's claims of pain and her apparent suffering were often manifestations of drug-seeking behavior. Dr. Hillman, having participated in Mrs. Hillman's treatments by other physicians for drug addiction, was certainly aware of her long-standing problems with drug abuse and dependency. While Dr. Podobnikar testified that Dr. Hillman "struggled" to withstand the temptation to pacify Mrs. Hillman with medications (Tr. at 117-118, 125), the evidence shows that he often succumbed to this temptation. By acceding to his wife's requests for narcotic medications, Dr. Hillman knew or should have known that his compliance would result in establishing her addiction and allowing it to exist over a period of many years.

Dr. Hillman attempted to show that his prescriptions for Mrs. Hillman were justified by documented medical conditions. However, the record shows that other physicians attended Mrs. Hillman for these medical conditions, with the exception of esophageal dilations which were performed at home on an "as needed" basis. Furthermore, by Dr. Hillman's own admission, after February, 1985, Mrs. Hillman had no significant medical problems other than relatively rare esophageal dilations; yet he continued to prescribe for her substantial quantities of Percocet, Demerol, Restoril, and Tylenol 3 for unspecified "other nagging type of pains or complaints" (Tr. at 42-43). This Hearing Officer must conclude that Dr. Hillman's "treatment" of his wife in this manner amounted to cognizant prescribing of drugs to an addict.

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HEALTH SERVICES
DIVISION

The testimony and evidence in this matter overwhelmingly support the allegations stated in the Board's February 13, 1986, citation letter. These charges are not substantially rebutted by the Respondent. In considering disposition, it should be noted that no evidence was presented that Dr. Hillman has prescribed inappropriately to anyone other than his wife.

Accordingly, I find that the acts, conduct, or omissions of Barry Hillman, M.D., with regard to Findings of Fact #1 through #4 above constitute violations of:

- a. Section 4731.22(B)(2), Ohio Revised Code, "Failure to use reasonable care discrimination in the administration of drugs, or failure to employ acceptable scientific methods in the selection of drugs or other modalities for treatment of disease;"
- b. Section 4731.22(B)(3), Ohio Revised Code, "Selling prescribing, giving away, or administering drugs for other than legal and legitimate therapeutic purposes or conviction of violation of any federal or state law regulating the possession, distribution, or use of any drug;" and
- c. Section 4731.22(B)(6), Ohio Revised Code, "A departure from, or the failure to conform to minimal standards of care of similar practitioners under the same or similar circumstances, whether or not actual injury to a patient is established."

PROPOSED ORDER

It is hereby ORDERED that the license of Barry Hillman, M.D., to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Ohio be REVOKED.

Such revocation is stayed subject to a probationary term of five (5) years, upon the following terms and conditions:

1. Dr. Hillman shall obey all federal, state and local laws and all rules governing the practice of medicine in Ohio.

Dear Doctor Hillman:

In accordance with Chapter 119., Ohio Revised Code, you are hereby notified that the State Medical Board of Ohio intends to determine whether or not to limit, revoke, suspend, refuse to register or reinstate your certificate to practice medicine and surgery or to reprimand or place you on probation for the following reason:

1.
