
Dear Doctor Suarez:

Such an appeal may be taken to the Court of Common Pleas in the county in which your place of business is located or to said court of the county in which you reside. If you are not a resident of and have no place of business in Ohio, you may appeal to the Court of Common Pleas in Franklin County, Ohio.

Such an appeal, setting forth the Order appealed from and the grounds of the appeal, must be commenced by the filing of Notice of Appeal with the State Medical Board of Ohio and the appropriate court within fifteen (15) days after the mailing of this notice and in accordance with the requirements of Section 119.12 of the Ohio Revised Code.



FINDINGS, ORDER, AND JOURNAL ENTRY

This matter came on for consideration after a denial letter was sent to Valeriano Suarez, M.D., by the Ohio State Medical Board on December 7, 1983.

On December 7, 1983, notice was given to Valeriano Suarez, M.D., that the State Medical Board of Ohio intended to deny his application for reinstatement of his license to practice medicine and surgery in Ohio and that he was entitled to a hearing if such hearing was requested within thirty (30) days of the mailing of said notice. Dr. Suarez has not requested a hearing, and thirty (30) days have elapsed since the mailing of the aforesaid notice.

WHEREFORE, it is hereby ORDERED that for the reasons outlined in the December 7, 1983 letter of notice which is attached hereto and incorporated herein, accordingly, the reinstatement application of Valeriano Suarez, M.D. to practice medicine and surgery in Ohio be permanently DENIED.

This Order shall become effective on the 8th day of February, 1984.

This Order is hereby entered upon the Journal of the State Medical Board of Ohio for the 8th day of February, 1984, and the original thereof shall be kept with said Journal.

Dear Doctor Suarez:

In accordance with Chapter 119., Ohio Revised Code, you are hereby notified that the State Medical Board of Ohio proposes to deny your application for the reinstatement or restoration of your Ohio license to practice medicine and surgery under authority of Section 4731.22, Ohio Revised Code, for one or more of the following reasons:

1. On or about May 21, 1974, you were convicted in the United States District for the Northern District of Illinois, Eastern Division, of eighteen (18) counts of knowingly, willfully and intentionally dispensing and conspiring to dispense tablets containing narcotic drugs, Schedule II and Schedule III controlled substances in violation of Title 21, United States Code, Sections 841(a)(1) and 846.

Pursuant to Section 4731.22(B)(10), Ohio Revised Code, effective prior to August 27, 1982, conviction of a felony committed not in the course of practice is grounds for the Board to refuse to reinstate your license to practice medicine in Ohio.

Pursuant to Section 4731.22(B)(11), Ohio Revised Code, effective prior to August 27, 1982, conviction of a felony or misdemeanor committed in the course of practice is grounds for the Board to refuse to reinstate your license to practice medicine in Ohio.

Further, in accordance with Section 4731.222, Ohio Revised Code, before restoring to good standing a certificate which has been in a suspended or inactive state for any cause for more than two years, the state medical board may require the applicant to pass an oral or written exam, or both, to determine his present fitness to resume practice. The board shall also consider the moral background and the activities of the applicant during the period of suspension or inactivity.

2. On or about August 30, 1983, the Medical Licensing Board of Indiana revoked your license to practice medicine in Indiana for a minimum of seven (7) years pursuant to the 1974 Illinois conviction.

Pursuant to Section 4731.22(B)(18), Ohio Revised Code, the revocation or suspension by another state of a license or certificate to practice issued by the proper licensing authority of that state for an action that would also have been a violation of this chapter is grounds for the Board to refuse to reinstate your license to practice medicine in Ohio.


In accordance with Chapter 119., Ohio Revised Code, you are hereby advised that you have a right to a hearing in this matter. If you wish to request such a hearing, this request must be made within thirty (30) days of the time of mailing of this notice.

You are further advised that you are entitled to appear at such hearing in person, or by your attorney, or you may present your position, arguments, or contentions in writing, and that at the hearing you may present evidence and examine witnesses appearing for or against you.

In the event there is no request for such hearing made within thirty (30) days of the time of mailing of this notice, the State Medical Board of Ohio may, in your absence and upon consideration of this matter, determine whether or not to refuse to reinstate your certificate to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Ohio.

Please find enclosed copies of the applicable Sections of the Ohio Revised Code for your reference.
