

FINDINGS, ORDER AND JOURNAL ENTRY

This matter came on for consideration after a citation letter was mailed to Robert L. Hauman, M.D., by the State Medical Board of Ohio on May 12, 1994.

By letter dated May 11, 1994, notice was given to Robert L. Hauman, M.D., that the State Medical Board intended to consider disciplinary action regarding his license to practice medicine and surgery in Ohio, and that he was entitled to a hearing if such hearing was requested within thirty (30) days of the mailing of said notice. In accordance with Section 119.09, Ohio Revised Code, said notice was sent via certified mail, return receipt requested, to the last known address of record of Robert L. Hauman, M.D., that being 1920 Collingwood, Toledo, Ohio, 43624. Notice was also sent via certified mail, returned receipt requested, to Robert L. Hauman, M.D., #41687-060, Federal Corrections Institute, Mid Atlantic Region, F.C.I. Ashland, Kentucky, Ashland, Kentucky, 41101.


No response has been received from Dr. Hauman, and more than thirty days have now elapsed since the mailing of the aforesaid notice.

WHEREFORE, it is hereby ORDERED that for the reasons outlined in the May 11, 1994 letter of notice, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein, accordingly, the license of Robert L. Hauman, M.D., to practice medicine and surgery in Ohio be REVOKED.

This ORDER shall become effective IMMEDIATELY.



Dear Doctor Hauman:

In accordance with Chapter 119., Ohio Revised Code, you are hereby notified that the State Medical Board of Ohio intends to determine whether or not to limit, revoke, suspend, refuse to register or reinstate your certificate to practice medicine and surgery, or to reprimand or place you on probation for one or more of the following reasons:

- (1) On or about November 24, 1993, the United States District Court, Northern District of Ohio, Western Division, found you guilty of one (1) felony count of Conspiracy to commit bank fraud, in violation of Title 18, U.S.C. Section 371. Further, the Court found you guilty of five (5) felony counts of Bribery, in violation of Title 18, U.S.C. Section 666(a)(2) and one (1) felony count of Bank fraud, in violation of Title 18, U.S.C. Section 1344. You were sentenced to imprisonment for a term of four and one half (4 1/2) years and to make restitution of \$441,737.45.

Your acts, conduct, and/or omissions as alleged in paragraph (1) above, individually and/or collectively, constitute "a plea of guilty to, or a judicial finding of guilt of, a felony," as that clause is used in Section 4731.22(B)(9), Ohio Revised Code.

- (2) In applying for renewal of the registration of your certificate to practice medicine or surgery as of December 31, 1990, you certified that you had completed during the last registration period (January 1, 1989-December 31, 1990) the requisite hours of Continuing Medical Education (CME) as required by Section 4731.281, Ohio Revised Code.
- (3) On February 13, 1992, your agent signed for the certified mail letter from the State Medical Board which informed you that you were required to complete a log listing your CME for the January 1, 1989 to December 31, 1990, registration period and to provide documentation

that you had actually completed at least thirty (30) hours of Category 1 CME credits. Your letter of April 2, 1992, did not provide the requested CME log, rather you asked for clarification on your CME requirements. By letter dated June 2, 1992, the State Medical Board again requested that you submit documentation of your CME credits for the above period and explained that the CME requirements are the same for all physicians licensed in Ohio. You failed to respond to this repeated request for log certification. You have failed to submit any documentation of CME completed for the above registration period.

- (4) Your lack of response to the notices as detailed in the above paragraph (3) rebuts the presumption that you did complete the requisite hours of Continuing Medical Education, and/or demonstrates that you failed to keep detailed records of CME taken.

Your acts in certifying to the State Medical Board that you had completed the statutorily required Continuing Medical Education, as set forth in the above paragraph (1), when you had not, in fact, done so, constitute "fraud, misrepresentation, or deception in applying for or securing any license or certificate issued by the board," as that clause is used in Section 4731.22(A), Ohio Revised Code.

Further, such failure to obtain the requisite Continuing Medical Education and submit documentation of same constitutes "(v)iolating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the violation of, or conspiring to violate, any provisions of this chapter or any rule promulgated by the board," as that clause is used in Section 4731.22(B)(20), Ohio Revised Code, to wit: Section 4731.281, Ohio Revised Code, and Rules 4731-10-03 and 4731-10-08, Ohio Administrative Code.

Pursuant to Chapter 119., Ohio Revised Code, you are hereby advised that you are entitled to a hearing in this matter. If you wish to request such hearing, the request must be made in writing and must be received in the offices of the State Medical Board within thirty (30) days of the time of mailing of this notice.


You are further advised that you are entitled to appear at such hearing in person, or by your attorney, or by such other representative as is permitted to practice before this agency, or you may present your position, arguments, or contentions in writing, and that at the hearing you may present evidence and examine witnesses appearing for or against you.

May 11, 1994

In the event that there is no request for such hearing received within thirty (30) days of the time of mailing of this notice, the State Medical Board may, in your absence and upon consideration of this matter, determine whether or not to limit, revoke, suspend, refuse to register or reinstate your certificate to practice medicine and surgery or to reprimand or place you on probation.
