I understand that as a result of the voluntary surrender herein, that I am no longer permitted to practice medicine or surgery in any form or manner in Ohio.

Dear Doctor Spott:

In accordance with Chapter 119., Ohio Revised Code, you are hereby notified that the State Medical Board of Ohio proposes to limit, reprimand, revoke, suspend, place on probation, refuse to register, or reinstate your medical certificate under authority of Section 4731.22, Ohio Revised Code, as in effect prior to August 27, 1982, for one or more of the following reasons:

1. On or about September 1981, you were convicted of a one count misdemeanor for false pretenses in the Criminal Court of Baltimore for obtaining from the Maryland Medicaid Assistance Program the sum of seven thousand nine hundred one dollars and ninety-six cents (\$7,901.96).

Pursuant to Section 4731.22(B)(11), Ohio Revised Code, the conviction of a felony or misdemeanor committed in the course of practice is grounds to limit, reprimand, revoke, suspend, place on probation, refuse to register, or reinstate you medical certificate.

Pursuant to Section 4731.22(B)(9), Ohio Revised Code, the obtaining of or attempting to obtain, money or anything of value by fraudulent misrepresentations in the course of treatment is grounds to reprimand, revoke, suspend, place on probation, refuse to register, or reinstate your medical certificate.

In accordance with Chapter 119., Ohio Revised Code, you are hereby advised that you have a right to a hearing in this matter. If you wish to request such a hearing, this request must be made within thirty (30) days of the time of mailing of this notice.

You are further advised that you are entitled to appear at such hearing in person, or by your attorney, or you may present your position, arguments, or contentions in writing, and that at the hearing you may present evidence and examine witnesses appearing for or against you.


In the event there is no request for such hearing made within thirty (30) days of the time of mailing of this notice, the State Medical Board of Ohio may in your absence and upon consideration of this matter, determine the final action on your certificate to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Ohio.
