

Dear Doctor Redmon:

Due to your failure to submit to a psychiatric examination on May 17, 2007, as ordered by the State Medical Board of Ohio [Board] and your failure to notify the Board of any circumstances beyond your control preventing you from submitting to said examination, pursuant to Section 4731.22(B)(19), Ohio Revised Code, a legal presumption has been established that you have admitted the factual and legal allegations demonstrating an inability to practice according to acceptable and prevailing standards of care by reason of mental illness or physical illness, including, but not limited to, physical deterioration that adversely affects cognitive, motor, or perceptive skills, as alleged against you in the Board's letter dated April 5, 2007, and sent to you by certified mail [April 5, 2007 certified letter] so ordering you to submit to such examination.

In accordance with Chapter 119., Ohio Revised Code, you are hereby notified that the Board intends, for one or more of the following reasons, to determine whether your failure to submit to the aforementioned examination was due to circumstances beyond your control, which would rebut the legal presumption of an inability to practice and merit rescheduling the examination as directed by the Board, or conversely, whether your failure to submit to the aforementioned examination was due to circumstances within your control, which would render the legal presumption of an inability to practice conclusive and result in the Board further determining whether to limit, revoke, permanently revoke, suspend, refuse to register or reinstate your certificate to practice medicine and surgery, or to reprimand you or place you on probation based upon your legally admitted inability to practice:

- (1) By letter dated April 5, 2007, the Board notified you of its determination that it had reason to believe that you are in violation of Section 4731.22(B)(19), Ohio Revised Code, and ordered you to undergo a psychiatric examination to determine if you are in violation of Section 4731.22(B)(19), Ohio Revised Code. The Board's determination was based upon one or more of the reasons outlined in such letter, which included the following:

Mailed 9-13-07

- (a) Records received by the Board from a locum tenens agency through which you had obtained employment contain the summary of a telephone message from you dated June 2, 2006, where you said you were desperate to speak with a certain person at the locum tenens agency, saying further that you were being followed everywhere you go by awful people you called “demons from hell.”

On or about June 2, 2006, you had a telephone conversation with such agency staff person wherein you reported that people had been following you for years because they were trying to get you involved in prostitution. You said that they would have television programs put on your television in the hotel rooms where you stayed and that they spoke specifically to you. You also stated that they dressed as transvestites so that you would not recognize them, but that you knew who they were, and that they had started following you to the grocery store. You stated further that you had not been able to buy food for days because they follow you wherever you go.

In a telephone conversation summary dated June 5, 2006, it is reported that when you were asked if you had been on medication or would speak to a therapist, you said that pills would not stop them from following you, and said anti-depressants would more likely make you commit suicide. When asked if you had contacted the police about people following you, you said you had called the police, senators and a lawyer but the organization had paid them all off not to help you. During this telephone conversation, you said that a medical facility in South Dakota had allowed them in as patients and that because you “blew the whistle” on them, the medical facility was fined. You also said that the people who were following you came in as patients at the medical clinic where you were working near Erie, Pennsylvania.

On or about June 9, 2006, your position through the Erie, Pennsylvania, medical clinic was terminated due to concerns about your behavior and paranoia.

- (b) On or about January 24, 2007, in response to a letter from the Board, you appeared at an office conference for the purpose of discussing issues related to your application for restoration of your Ohio medical license. You reported that since your Ohio license had lapsed in April 2002, you had worked as a locum tenens physician, and that your most recent job in Ashtabula, Ohio, for eight months, represents your longest term of employment.

When asked by Board staff to explain why you were not offered a permanent job in Ashtabula, Ohio, you reported that you had argued and had a conflict with an employee there. When asked to elaborate, you began first by saying that you had had problems when you lived in Seattle, Washington, having to do with a relationship that “went wrong,” and that someone had put information on the internet that you were a homophobe. When you were asked to relate this to your Ashtabula employment, you responded that you did not think the Ashtabula employee with whom you had a conflict was homosexual, but she had some issues; she had heard about you and would “sorta needle [you]” every time you came in; and that for the past six years you have had problems because of your Seattle experience.

You related further that your employment-related problems over the last six years were due to the notion held by some fellow employees and some patients that you were a homophobe. You described one incident at a medical center in South Carolina, when, while treating an HIV patient, his friends, who were sitting around his hospital bed, said, “That’s her we heard about.” You said that these people had heard about you through the internet. You characterized your life for the last six years as a “nightmare.”

You then reported that a friend of yours from college, whom you had known for 25 years, heard rumors about you because she lives in German Village, an area near Columbus, Ohio. You also alleged that people in the Board’s offices knew of information about you on the internet. You stated that you were fired from a medical center in Arizona because most of the people who worked there were homosexual, and had heard about you through the internet. You related the story of one patient at the Arizona medical center who said to you that he thought you believed he would go to hell because he had HIV and was homosexual, and that the nurses got together with the Arizona medical board and caused you to be fired. You also reported that you encountered difficulties in Rochester, New York, which, you said, has a big homosexual population, and where, if you “blinked the wrong way, [you were] causing problems.”

You went on to say that the problem in Seattle began because you dated someone you did not want to date, that you were not homophobic but that you did not want a homosexual husband. You further stated that the average person on the sidewalk in Columbus will know who you are because of this, especially in German Village.

- (2) The April 5, 2007 certified letter from the Board further notified you that, pursuant to Section 4731.22(B)(19), Ohio Revised Code, you were ordered to submit to an examination. The examination was scheduled to take place with Stephen Noffsinger, M.D., at University Hospitals of Cleveland, Hanna Pavilion, 1st Floor, Room 1191, 11100 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio 44106, on May 17, 2007, at 1:00 p.m.

The April 5, 2007 certified letter from the Board further notified you that failure of an individual to submit to an examination as directed constitutes an admission of the allegations against the individual unless the failure is due to circumstances beyond the individual's control. Finally, the letter notified you that if you failed to submit to the examination, and such failure was not due to circumstances beyond your control, the Board would be authorized to enter a default and final order without the taking of testimony or presentation of evidence.

- (3) You were duly notified of the examination order and its scheduled date. The certified letter return receipt is signed by you and dated April 10, 2007.
- (4) By letter dated May 17, 2007, the Board was notified that you failed to appear for the examination that the Board scheduled for you. At no time did you inform the Board that your failure to appear was due to circumstances beyond your control. Accordingly, pursuant to Section 4731.22(B)(19), Ohio Revised Code, and in consideration of the affidavits of Karen Mortland, Enforcement Attorney, and Debra L. Jones, CME and Renewal Officer, copies of which are attached hereto and fully incorporated herein, the Board hereby FINDS that you have admitted the truth of the allegations demonstrating an inability to practice as set forth in the April 5, 2007 letter from the Board. The Board FINDS that pursuant to Section 4731.22(B)(19), Ohio Revised Code, your failure to appear for the examination ordered by the Board as directed constitutes an "[i]nability to practice according to acceptable and prevailing standards of care by reason of mental illness or physical illness, including, but not limited to, physical deterioration that adversely affects cognitive, motor, or perceptive skills," as that clause is used in Section 4731.22(B)(19), Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4731.22(B)(19), Ohio Revised Code, provides that any individual who applies for or receives a certificate to practice accepts the privilege of practicing in this state, and by doing so, shall be deemed to have given consent to submit to a mental or physical examination when directed to do so by the Board in writing; and that the expense of the examination is the responsibility of the individual compelled to be examined. Failure to submit to a mental or physical examination ordered by the Board constitutes an admission of the allegations against the individual unless the failure is due to circumstances beyond the individual's control, and a default and final order may be entered without the taking of testimony or presentation of evidence.

Your acts, conduct, and/or omissions as alleged in paragraphs (1) through (4) above, individually and/or collectively, constitute “[i]nability to practice according to acceptable and prevailing standards of care by reason of mental illness or physical illness, including, but not limited to, physical deterioration that adversely affects cognitive, motor, or perceptive skills,” as that clause is used in Section 4731.22(B)(19), Ohio Revised Code.

Further, your acts, conduct, and/or omissions as alleged in paragraph (4) above, individually and/or collectively, constitute “[f]ailure to cooperate in an investigation conducted by the board under division (F) of this section, including failure to comply with a subpoena or order issued by the board or failure to answer truthfully a question presented by the board at a deposition or in written interrogatories, except that failure to cooperate with an investigation shall not constitute grounds for discipline under this section if a court of competent jurisdiction has issued an order that either quashes a subpoena or permits the individual to withhold the testimony or evidence in issue,” as that clause is used in Section 4731.22(B)(34), Ohio Revised Code.

Pursuant to Chapter 119., Ohio Revised Code, and Chapter 4731., Ohio Revised Code, you are hereby advised that you are entitled to a hearing concerning whether your failure to submit to the examination as directed was due to circumstances beyond your control. If you wish to request such hearing, the request must be made in writing and must be received in the offices of the State Medical Board within thirty days of the time of mailing of this notice.


You are further advised that, if you timely request a hearing, you are entitled to appear at such hearing in person, or by your attorney, or by such other representative as is permitted to practice before this agency, or you may present your position, arguments, or contentions in writing, and that at the hearing you may present evidence and examine witnesses appearing for or against you.

In the event that there is no request for such hearing received within thirty days of the time of mailing of this notice, the State Medical Board may, in your absence and upon consideration of this matter, determine whether or not to limit, revoke, permanently revoke, suspend, refuse to register or reinstate your certificate to practice medicine and surgery or to reprimand you or place you on probation.

Please note that, whether or not you request a hearing, Section 4731.22(L), Ohio Revised Code, provides that “[w]hen the board refuses to grant a certificate to an applicant, revokes an individual’s certificate to practice, refuses to register an applicant, or refuses to reinstate an individual’s certificate to practice, the board may specify that its action is permanent. An individual subject to a permanent action taken by the board is forever thereafter ineligible to hold a certificate to practice and the board shall not accept an application for reinstatement of the certificate or for issuance of a new certificate.”






